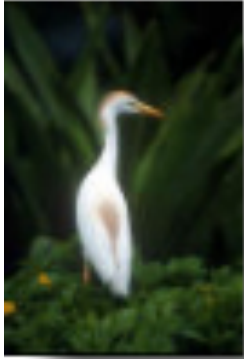

Do you need to submit a protocol?

- Vertebrate research
- Maintaining in the lab
- Collecting in the field
- Mark/recapture
- Tissue collection
- Euthanizing vertebrates
- Observational studies/no manipulation
- Tissue only/dissecting previously euthanized animals



Procedures

- CITI: Animal care and use training
 - Online training, courses specific to your research
 - Look at the catalogue at www.citiprogram.org under Courses, and Animal Care And Use link to determine which courses are appropriate for your research
 - Often, animal- specific courses are the only required courses

Procedures (cont)

- TOPAZ: request user account log-in
 - Form to print, fill out and send to Denise Yee
deniseye@hawaii.edu (primary IACUC contact)
 - Create protocol
 - Review process takes 4-5 weeks
 - Protocol is valid for 1 year, but can be renewed annually
 - For any changes to protocol, you must submit an Amendment

Important protocol information

- All personnel on protocol must go through appropriate training courses
- Review policies and guidelines (link on IACUC home page)
 - These policies change often and only updated policies are accepted on protocols (e.g. capture methods, euthanization methods)

When a protocol is approved

- Pre-protocol inspection of lab space
- Semi-annual inspections:
 - Veterinarians, various personnel on IACUC committee
- Other paperwork required:
 - Disaster Plans for animal housing facility
 - Reports of any unintentional animal death
