E5. 217 Reinstatement of Deployed Active-Duty Military,  
Hawai'i National Guard, and Reservists

I. Introduction

This executive policy concerns the academic course of study for University of Hawai'i students who were deployed due to their status as members of the active-duty military (and their authorized dependents), the Hawai'i National Guard, or the military reserves.

II. Objectives

The purposes of this policy are to establish and promulgate procedures for campuses to handle the return of students who were deployed due to their status in the military, the Hawai'i National Guard, or the military reserves, and who are returning to the University of Hawai'i.

III. Policy Guidelines

The University will reinstate students who were deployed to their original course of study on the UH campus they last attended. They will have no loss of credit or privileges and will maintain registration priority consistent with their continuing student status when they return to their original campuses no more than one semester after they return from deployment, as long as the program and courses still exist and remain viable.

IV. Reporting

The Chancellors shall provide a report to the President each year by October 1 that lists the number of students assisted by the policy.
