Michael Plummer is Professor of Economics and Director of the Europe Campus, School of Advanced International Studies, Johns Hopkins University and a Senior Fellow at the East-West Center.

The rise of China, the U.S. push for the Trans Pacific Partnership trade agreement, and nationalistic concerns over foreign enterprises, among other factors, have led to rising political tensions in East Asia and concerns about whether the region's economies will continue to prosper. Join Professor Plummer as he explores how better economic policies and regional economic and political agreements could be the keys to easing regional tensions and reigniting strong Asian and global economic growth.
