Dr. Nakayama will be presenting his talk on Japan-U.S. relations especially in consideration of the 70th anniversary after the end of World War II. Attendees will gain an insight into America's roles in the Asia Pacific and beyond through the eyes of a well-known professor, author, and columnist, who will also share his personal experiences

in the context of this important relationship between the two allied nations.

Dr. Nakayama is also an Adjunct Fellow at the Japan Institute of International Affairs. He received his M.A. (1993) and Ph.D. (2001) from Aoyama Gakuin University, was a CNAPS Visiting Fellow at the Brookings Institution (2005-06), and has written two books and numerous articles on American politics, foreign policy, and international relations. He appears regularly on Japanese media and writes a monthly column for Japan News. He was the recipient of the Nakasone Yasuhiro Award (Incentive Award) in 2014.
