SB 2056 - RELATING TO SOIL CLASSIFICATIONS

Thank you for this opportunity to testify in <u>support</u> of SB 2056 relating to soil classifications.

As a Soil Scientist and past surveyor in the National Cooperative Soil Survey, and having soil surveyed the foothills of Mount Rainier and the Skagit River Valley in Washington, Dean Comerford has understood the importance and use of soils information in land use planning and agriculture. The Web Soil Survey (https://websoilsurvey.sc.egov.usda.gov/App/HomePage.htm) provides digitized soil maps and interpretive information. In addition, the College of Tropical Agriculture and Human Resources has an on-going research project in the Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Management that is evaluating crop suitability for current and climate change environments for a limited variety of crops across the state. These resources may be of use.
