SB 2820 SD2 - RELATING TO TEACHER COMPENSATION

Chair Onishi, Vice Chair Sayama, and members of the committee:

Thank you for the opportunity to provide testimony on SB 2820 SD2, Relating to Teacher Compensation.

The University of Hawai'i at Mānoa, College of Education supports SB 2820 SD2 which provides a pay differential to help address various labor shortages in schools. The teacher pay differentials will positively affect the following labor shortage areas: special education, hard-to-staff geographic locations, and Hawaiian language immersion programs.
