SB 558 SD1 - RELATING TO VALUE-ADDED PRODUCTS

The University of Hawai'i supports the intent of SB 558 SD1, which establishes under the Agribusiness Development Corporation a "food and product innovation network" providing access to facilities, resources, expertise and education to capitalize on the "Made in Hawai'i", "Produced in Hawai'i", or "Processed in Hawai'i" brand, critical to meet the State's agricultural and economic diversification goals.

Synergies between partner and primary network members can expand access statewide, and leverage resources while avoiding unnecessary duplication in support of innovation and business development.
