It is with the utmost respect and privilege that I submit this written testimony supporting Kumu Rubellite Kawena Johnson's nomination for an Honorary Doctorate of Humane Letters from UH–Mānoa. I have known Ruby for nearly thirty years, each of which has been a unique learning experience for me. My first contact with Ruby was as a tutee under her expertise mentorship in Polynesian culture and astronomy. Over the years that close relationship developed into a collegial bonding where we've co-taught and co-presented topics in Polynesian astronomy.

Ruby is the one of foremost experts in Polynesian star identification. Her seminal work resulted in the publication of the classic book $N\bar{a}$ Inoa $H\bar{o}k\bar{u}$, which she co-authored with John Kaipo Mahelona. This one-of-a-kind compilation of Hawaiian and Pacific star names remains the primary source for archaeoastronomical researchers and indigenous groups like the Polynesian Voyaging Society. So essential was this catalogue of ancient star names throughout Oceania that the book was recently revised and expanded under the authorship of Ruby Johnson, John Mahelona and internationally noted archaeoastronomer Clive Ruggles.

Ruby has conducted significant archaeological research throughout the State of Hawai'i. Among them include her publication on *Ahu a 'Umi* as viewed from the standpoint of a traditional heiau construction where the foundation was laid down prior to its enclosing walls.

Ruby also conducted extensive research on Kahoʻolawe. Among her numerous studies of this historically important island was a report on the archaeoastronomical significance of Kahoʻolawe's sites, which she undertook through field excursions for the Kahoʻolawe Conveyance Commission. This indispensable research was published as *Consultant Report No. 9: Kahoʻolawe's Potential Astro-Archaeological Resources*.

Ruby is a consummate researcher whose passion is to reveal Hawai'i's past through exhaustive methodologies. Her specialty in Polynesian astronomy and its relationship to its archaeological sites has been a cherished gift to the people of Hawai'i.

My name is Mahina Kaomea. I am a prospective student testifying on Agenda Item D to represent the voices of students, faculty, and community members deeply opposed to the renewal of the University Affiliated Research Center (UARC) contract between UH and the U.S. Navy.

Our testimony stands alongside more than a thousand signatures on a public petition, urging you to halt the renewal of this contract and place it on a future agenda for full public discussion.

Agenda Item D, the extramural awards year-end report, reveals UH's substantial dependence on Department of Defense (DoD) funding, including task orders for UARC research. This arrangement directs UH's resources toward military projects that frequently lack transparency, classified beyond public oversight. Despite repeated requests for information, we cannot confirm that weapons development is not occurring under UARC, especially with project titles like "Naval Special Warfare Prototyping on Demand." This setup fundamentally conflicts with UH's mission as a public institution and Native Hawaiian Place of Learning, restricting academic freedom and intellectual integrity.

- 1. **Full Transparency in the Renewal Process:** We demand that President Lassner and the Board include the public in any decision to renew the UARC contract. A contract of this magnitude and nature should not move forward without significant public input.
- 2. **Public Hearings on the UARC Renewal:** We ask the Board to hold multiple public forums, as it did between 2005-2008 during the establishment of the UARC, to ensure thorough feedback from students, faculty, and community members. With a proposed contract renewal worth \$140 million, UH must prioritize public accountability.
- 3. **Disclosure of Contract Information:** Though some documents are classified, UH has a responsibility to disclose the maximum amount of information. We demand that UH advocate for reclassification of contract details to allow for public review.
- 4. Commitment to Native Hawaiian Values: UH must honor its responsibility to Kānaka 'Ōiwi and the broader Hawai'i community by refusing to renew this UARC contract. The legacy of military encroachment on Hawaiian lands has led to lasting environmental

destruction and desecration of 'āina across Hawai'i. We urge UH to honor its commitment to being a Native Hawaiian Place of Learning by refusing to align with entities that perpetuate this harm.

As a prospective student of Native Hawaiian descent, I urge you to strongly consider the impact that signing military research contracts, such as the UARC contract, will have on your Native Hawaiian constituents.

I have been dreaming of attending UH for almost as long as I've known how to read. All of my biggest heroes teach there: Kumu Jon Osorio, Kumu Lilikalā Kame'elehiwa, Kumu Noelani Goodyear-Ka'ōpua. From these intellectual heroes and countless other Hawaiian scholars, I learned about the devastating impact that the military has had on our lands and our people, especially in the bombing of Kaho'olawe and Mākua. With the hindsight of history, bombing an entire island and destroying its precious freshwater resources is unbelievable, certainly something to be stopped at all costs. But such military-caused environmental and cultural tragedies are not so easily questioned when they're happening today, such as in the case of the jet fuel leaks at Red Hill/Kapūkakī or the bombing of Ka'ula.

I am planning to apply for PhD programs at UH Mānoa this Fall, but that dream of attending UH feels more conflicted than it ever has. I am deeply concerned about our public university's incredible research talent and facilities being used in military-funded research, especially given the extractive history of the military's relationship with Hawaiian lands, water, and people. Furthermore, I worry that such research, even if it seems on the surface to be completely disconnected from the military's imperial pursuits, might become intellectual property of the U.S. Navy or DoD and later co-opted to facilitate the spread of violence and imperialism against our relatives in the Pacific and beyond. And I am not the only one who feels this way - I can assure you that thousands of the Native Hawaiian students enrolled at your institution, along with many more thousands of faculty, alumni, and community members would be outraged, concerned, and deeply disillusioned if the UARC contract were to be renewed once again.

UH cannot claim to be a Native Hawaiian Place of Learning while advancing military research that prioritizes secrecy and may involve weapons development on Indigenous lands. Extramural funding should be used to support research that enriches our community, not deepens our institution's ties to militarization.

Alongside more than a thousand of our classmates, peers, faculty, staff, and community members, we demand that UH take a stand for transparency, accountability, and integrity. We urge the Board to recognize the significance of this moment, commit to a transparent review, and reconsider the presence of UARC at our university in light of UH's mission.

However, we assert that this does not absolve UH of its responsibility to be transparent about research endeavors conducted at a public university, particularly contracts relating to the U.S. Navy. We therefore demand that UH both consent to the public disclosure of all documents relating to the UARC contract and pressure the Navy to change the classification level of these documents, making public disclosure possible.
- 4. Commitment to Native Hawaiian Values: UH must honor its responsibility to Kānaka 'Ōiwi and the broader Hawai'i community by refusing to renew this UARC contract. The legacy of military encroachment on Hawaiian lands has led to lasting environmental destruction and desecration of 'āina across Hawai'i. We urge UH to honor its commitment to being a Native Hawaiian Place of Learning by refusing to align with entities that perpetuate this harm.

This is exactly the kind of research Linda Tuhiwai-Smith was talking about when she said that "research is one of the dirtiest words for indigenous people." As a scientist, as a kanaka oiwi, as a woman, as a human being I know that research and advancement does not need to and never should function to "increase lethality" in the words of our president David Lassner. Who is advancing with this kind of research? The most genocidal military in the world? The selfish individuals making a profit? It's certainly not kanaka oiwi and the people of Hawaii while we continue to die of cancer and poison injected into our wai and aina by the very branches of the military you seek to work with.

UH cannot claim to be a Native Hawaiian Place of Learning while advancing military research that prioritizes secrecy and may involve weapons development on stolen Indigenous lands. Extramural funding should be used to support research that serves the needs of our community, not the genocidal American war machine.

Alongside more than a thousand of our classmates, peers, faculty, staff, and community members, we demand that UH take a stand for transparency, accountability, and integrity. We urge the Board to recognize the significance of this moment, commit to a transparent review, and reconsider the presence of UARC at our university in light of UH's mission.

We cannot enter into financial agreements without holding them accountable for the global destruction they have wrought, and how their actions will continue to disrupt our collective futures.

Concerns Related to Agenda Item D. Fiscal Year (FY) 2024 Extramural Awards Year-End Report & FY 2025 Funding Quarter 1 Report

Aloha Chair Lee and Members of the Board,

My name is Kawaiola Kapuni and I'm testifying today alongside my peers testifying on *Agenda Item D* to represent the voices of students, faculty, and community members deeply opposed to the renewal of the University Affiliated Research Center (UARC) contract between UH and the U.S. Navy.

Our testimony stands alongside more than a thousand signatures on a public petition, urging you to halt the renewal of this contract and place it on a future agenda for full public discussion.

Agenda Item D, the extramural awards year-end report, reveals UH's substantial dependence on Department of Defense (DoD) funding, including task orders for UARC research. This arrangement directs UH's resources toward military projects that frequently lack transparency, classified beyond public oversight. Despite repeated requests for information, we cannot confirm that weapons development is not occurring under UARC, especially with project titles like "Naval Special Warfare Prototyping on Demand." This setup fundamentally conflicts with UH's mission as a public institution and Native Hawaiian Place of Learning, restricting academic freedom and intellectual integrity.

- 1. **Full Transparency in the Renewal Process:** We ask that President Lassner recognize that signing a 10-year contract with the U.S. Navy and Department of Defense should not be a decision he makes alone. We demand that UARC contract renewal be placed on the Board of Regents' agenda for an upcoming meeting so that stakeholders can give testimony and comment on the matter of contract renewal itself.
- 2. **Public Hearings on the UARC Renewal:** We demand that the Board of Regents hold multiple public comment meetings to allow for extended community input hearing. These hearings would align with the procedure in 2006 in which several public comment meetings were held to allow for broader input. With a proposed contract renewal worth \$140 million, UH must prioritize public accountability.
- 3. **Disclosure of Contract Information:** We understand that documents relating to UARC cannot be released to the public without the Department of Defense changing the

classification level. However, we assert that this does not absolve UH of its responsibility to be transparent about research endeavors conducted at a public university, particularly contracts relating to the U.S. Navy. We therefore demand that UH both consent to the public disclosure of all documents relating to the UARC contract and pressure the Navy to change the classification level of these documents, making public disclosure possible.

4. Commitment to Native Hawaiian Values: UH must honor its responsibility to Kānaka 'Ōiwi and the broader Hawai'i community by refusing to renew this UARC contract. The legacy of military encroachment on Hawaiian lands has led to lasting environmental destruction and desecration of 'āina across Hawai'i. We urge UH to honor its commitment to being a Native Hawaiian Place of Learning by refusing to align with entities that perpetuate this harm.

Concerns Related to Agenda Item D. Fiscal Year (FY) 2024 Extramural Awards Year-End Report & FY 2025 Funding Quarter 1 Report

Aloha Chair Lee and Members of the Board,

We are submitting this written testimony in regards to Agenda Item D to represent the voices of students, faculty, and community members deeply opposed to the renewal of the University Affiliated Research Center (UARC) contract between UH and the U.S. Navy.

Agenda Item D, the extramural awards year-end report, reveals UH's substantial dependence on Department of Defense (DoD) funding, including task orders for UARC research. DoD funding comprised 9.6% of total extramural funding and 15.3% of federal extramural funding. ARL/UARC funding accounted for about 32.4% of that DoD funding.

This arrangement directs UH's resources toward military projects that frequently lack transparency, classified beyond public oversight. Despite repeated requests for information, we cannot confirm that weapons development is not occurring under UARC, especially with project titles like "Naval Special Warfare Prototyping on Demand." This setup fundamentally conflicts with UH's mission as a public institution and Native Hawaiian Place of Learning, restricting academic freedom and intellectual integrity.

In light of a continued lack of transparency in the process of renewing the UARC contract, we are presenting a public petition with 1,087 signatures- made up of 21.8% students and 13.3% alumni. Every single one of us are urging you to halt the renewal of this contract and place it on a future agenda for full public comment. The demands of the petition are as follows:

- 1. **Full Transparency in the Renewal Process:** We demand that President Lassner and the Board include the public in any decision to renew the UARC contract. A contract of this magnitude and nature should not move forward without significant public input.
- 2. **Public Hearings on the UARC Renewal:** We ask the Board to hold multiple public forums, as it did between 2005-2008 during the establishment of the UARC, to ensure thorough feedback from students, faculty, and community members. With a proposed contract renewal worth \$140 million, UH must prioritize public accountability.
- 3. **Disclosure of Contract Information:** Though some documents are classified, UH has a responsibility to disclose the maximum amount of information. We demand that UH advocate for reclassification of contract details to allow for public review.

4. Commitment to Native Hawaiian Values: UH must honor its responsibility to Kānaka 'Ōiwi and the broader Hawai'i community by refusing to renew this UARC contract. The legacy of military encroachment on Hawaiian lands has led to lasting environmental destruction and desecration of 'āina across Hawai'i. We urge UH to honor its commitment to being a Native Hawaiian Place of Learning by refusing to align with entities that perpetuate this harm.

UH cannot claim to be a Native Hawaiian Place of Learning while advancing military research that prioritizes secrecy and may involve weapons development on Indigenous lands. Extramural funding should be used to support research that enriches our community, not deepens our institution's ties to militarization.

Alongside more than a thousand of our classmates, peers, faculty, staff, and community members, we demand that UH take a stand for transparency, accountability, and integrity. We urge the Board to recognize the significance of this moment, commit to a transparent review, and reconsider the presence of UARC at our university in light of UH's mission.

Petition to President Lassner and the Board of Regents in Opposition to UH Renewal of the UARC Contract

The University of Hawai'i (UH) is on the brink of renewing a contract with the U.S Navy worth over \$140 million dollars. As students and community members, we are deeply concerned that the content of this contract has not been made public. The Applied Research Laboratory (ARL) was established in 2008, making UH the Navy's fifth University Affiliated Research Center (UARC) despite significant opposition. The ARL at UH is described as a "center of excellence" for both Navy and national defense needs which conducts research, development, testing, and evaluation to address problems. The contract between UH and the U.S. Navy has been renewed twice and is currently up for its third renewal in 2024. Regardless of the research topic, the Department of Defense has rights to the work conducted under the UARC contract and thus, can use research findings however they see fit, including waging warfare. The lack of transparency around this contract is disturbing, and thus, we strongly oppose its renewal.

The U.S. Military is responsible for a devastating legacy of environmental catastrophes and humanitarian abuses in Hawai'i such as the violent bombings of Kaho'olawe, Ka'ula, Mākua Valley, and Pōhakuloa; the Kapūkakī/Red Hill water crisis, and the ongoing desecration of sacred sites such as Mauna Kea, Haleakalā, Mokapu, Keawaopu'uloa and Nohili. The U.S. military's actions in Hawai'i are directly linked to violence and exploitation globally, including the current and ongoing U.S.-funded genocide in occupied Palestine. Militarization in any form is a direct threat to all people everywhere.

Opposition to UARC at UH is longstanding and well documented, going back to 2005 when the contract was first proposed. We are continuing this history in our opposition to the 2024 contract renewal, which, for the first time, includes an option to extend the contract for 10 years instead of the usual 5.

We ask President Lassner and the Board of Regents the following:

- 1. We ask that President Lassner recognize that signing a 10-year contract with the U.S. Navy and Department of Defense should not be a decision he makes alone. We demand that UARC contract renewal be placed on the Board of Regents' agenda for an upcoming meeting so that stakeholders can give testimony and comment on the matter of contract renewal itself.
- 2. We demand that the Board of Regents hold multiple public comment meetings to allow for extended community input hearing. These hearings would align with the procedure in 2006 in which several public comment meetings were held to allow for broader input.

- 3. We understand that documents relating to UARC cannot be released to the public without the Department of Defense changing the classification level. However, we assert that this does not absolve UH of its responsibility to be transparent about research endeavors conducted at a public university, particularly contracts relating to the U.S. Navy. We therefore demand that UH both consent to the public disclosure of all documents relating to the UARC contract and pressure the Navy to change the classification level of these documents, making public disclosure possible.
- 4. We demand that the University of Hawai'i fulfill its kuleana to Kānaka 'Ōiwi and nā po'e o Hawai'i nei by refusing to renew the 2024 UARC Contract.
