## **Director of Energy Management**

This is administrative work in providing system-wide leadership, planning, development, coordination and implementation of a comprehensive strategic plan and program that supports the University's and State's short- and long-range energy sustainability, carbon-neutrality and "net-zero" energy objectives. The initiatives focus on all areas of energy sustainability, including carbon neutrality, clean energy, energy efficiency and management, and renewable energy.

As a member of the Vice President's senior leadership team, the manager is responsible for developing and implementing system-wide policies, procedures and practices in collaboration with senior leaders to make the University a model in carbon neutrality and energy sustainability both in the State and among higher education institutions nationwide; integrating energy sustainability initiatives and programs into all areas of the University including instruction and curriculum, research, student and community engagement, capital projects and facilities upgrades, and daily operations; collaborating with administrators and managers in the development and implementation of energy strategies appropriate for individual campuses; and developing a business model that will create and reinvest savings generated by the energy management efforts.

Work requires extensive experience managing research and development projects in the electrical industry; extensive knowledge and understanding of current technology and best practices in the areas of sustainability, carbon neutrality and energy management principles to catalyze institutional transformation; and ability to generate and secure additional sources of funding to support initiatives. Work involves considerable contact and collaborative approach with University leadership including senior executives and administrators, campus administrators, legislators, city and county officials, federal and state agencies, various industry organizations, and general public. Work is performed with seasoned tact, diplomacy, initiative and sound judgment. Work is reviewed by the Vice President for Administration for results and effectiveness.
