Crafting a Life: Writing the Biography of a 20th-Century Woman Artist Born and Raised in Hawai'i



Juliette May Fraser (b. 1887 Honolulu; d. 1983 Honolulu) was an artistic phenomenon of 20th Century Hawai'i. She never departed from her single objective: to tell the story of these Islands authentically, always with a love for Hawai'i's natural beauty and the history, mythology, and culture of its people. Dr. Weiner will share her journey as Fraser's biographer, focusing on the roles relationships and documented research played in her pursuit of this Hawai'i artist.
