Dr. Kealoha Fox oversees social health integration at AlohaCare, president of the Institute for Climate and Peace, and proud graduate of the University of Hawai‘i. Kealoha applies Indigenous innovation for collaborative solutions in business, science, and policy. Her actions elevate healthy people, places, and futures through work uplifting mana and maui ola for social justice. She is the recipient of more than 60 awards, including a Gates Foundation Goalkeeper, Obama Leader Asia Pacific, and a candidate for the Pritzker Environmental Genius Award. Each year, Kealoha mentors dozens of young women inside and outside of the academy. Living her kuleana, Kealoha has been trained in traditional practices and protocol such as ho‘oponopono, hāhā, and lā‘au lapa‘au. The roles she is most proud of in her story thus far is as a mother and caregiver.
