For bright students, it is not uncommon for learning differences, processing challenges, or other neurodiversity to remain hidden all the way until high school or even college. High ability students have tremendous ability to mask their symptoms and compensate for disabilities, especially when typical school curriculum is too easy. It is when coursework becomes more rigorous that students may begin having trouble keeping up with their classes, managing their schedule, completing homework, understanding instruction, and may begin showing signs of anxiety, depression, or other mental health concerns. Learn about the most common challenges that may have been overlooked, clues to look for, and how to help - including going beyond the usual suspects. Once the root causes of a student's difficulties are identified, neuro affirming supports and accommodations that will be genuinely helpful become much clearer.
